



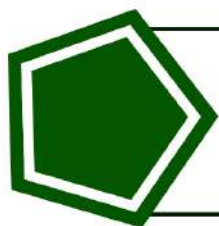

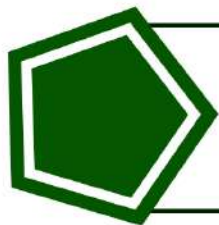
Guide on Collecting and Storing Free-Range Chicken (FRC) Eggs



Use plastic nest as it is more durable for long use. Put rice stalks inside it and keep it clean always.



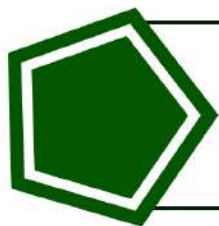
Collect eggs regularly once a day.



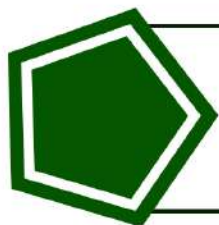
Cover the FRC nest in the afternoon to prevent FRC from staying long in the nest so as to maintain the cleanliness of the eggs in the nest.



Transfer the eggs in the egg tray. Separate those with cracks and dirty ones.



Keep the collected eggs in a cool area and with proper ventilation.



Eggs must be disposed, either consumed or sold within seven days.
